

March 10, 2020 - Free Motion Creativity and Modern FMQ Fillers and Fun Workshop

Mel Beach is a quilt artist, teacher and lecturer who loves stretching her creativity through her completion of more than 70 quilt challenges at the local and international level. She is an Aurifil Artisan, Michael Miller Fabric Ambassador, and a Featured Artist on The Quilt Show with Alex Anderson and Ricky Tims. The Modern FMQ Fillers and Fun workshop will be held on **Wednesday**, **March 11**, **2020**, **at 9395 Harritt Rd**, **Community Center**, **Lakeside**, **CA 92040**.



April 14, 2020 - Got Color and Large Mod Dog Workshop

Linda Sullivan is intensely passionate about the art of quilt making, adding a contemporary whimsical look adventurous applique and fearless use of color. She has designed over 100 quilt patterns, authored two books and even designed a 'Fun and Bright' fabric line. The Large Mod Dog workshop will be held on Wednesday, April 15, where the students will learn the basics of fun improv/wonky piecing, and fusible web machine applique.



May 12, 2020 - My Applique Journey and Crazy Cushion Workshop*

Becky McDaniel is an instructor and lecturer who will share her applique journey, give us a trunk show and outline the several types of applique she does in her projects. She won the Judges Recognition Award for her My Circle Jubilee quilt at the Spring 2019 Paducah show, will be published in the AQ magazine and be featured in the March 2020 AQ Calendar. The Crazy Cushion workshop will be held on Saturday, May 16, 2020.

*Please note – the May workshop on Saturday, May 16, is the same weekend that the Sunshine Guild has their annual retreat at Vina de Lestonnac in Temecula. If we have enough people at the retreat interested in taking this workshop, I'll arrange to have it held in Temecula. - Road to California Quilt Show is 23-25 January.
- The Women's Club of Lakeside is having their annual quilt show and invited our guild members to enter quilts. This is non-juried and no judging. Entry forms are due by 27 February. Flyers are also available for two other upcoming quilt shows: 1) Desert Guilds Quilt Show March 6 & 7 in Palm Springs and 2. Colorado River Quilters March 13 & 14 in Bullhead City.
- UFO Challenge: Of the 17 participants, 3 quilts were not completed. Teri Green won \$10 in the drawing. February's challenge is to complete #3.

Cuddle Quilts: Tanya Althof shared this month's featured pattern - Ground Cover by Jenny Doan. She has kits available. Please email her before the meeting if you need specific supplies.

Programs: Kathy Manuel announced the January workshop on a Dresden plate table runner will be at Rosie's.

Supply lists available. The March 11 workshop is Free Motion Quilting.

Sunshine Quilters' Retreat: Candi Ravenscraft announced the deposit for this year's retreat is due now. Balances will be due 1 May. There are still spaces available if you are interested. The retreat dates are May 14 - 17, 2019 at La Vina de Lestonnac Retreat Center in Temecula.

Seasonal Opportunity Quilt: Jo Miller is selling tickets this month and next for the heart wall hanging she made.

Monthly Block: December's block, "Perpetual Motion" was won by Cecelia Midgette. February's block is "Pink, Yellow and Orange BOM" provided by Teresa Keane. She shared that this block was previously suggested by Barbara Perez.

Once I was working and found that I could buy most of my clothing for the same or less then it cost to make them I quit sewing clothing except for "special or fancy" garments. Many years ago, Candi Ravenscraft and I were talking one day and she told me that she had signed up for a beginning quilting class that had been canceled. I told her about the one that I had started a few weeks back at the Adult School and why didn't she come with me. That is how we started quilting together. I bought my own used sewing machine when I was in my early 30's, I still have it even though it weighs a ton. I now have five machines but the one I use most is a Viking 555, which I love.

I don't have a lot of spare time to do much quilting right now, however I am looking forward to it when I retire and have more time on it. That goes for the other crafts I enjoy doing. At different times in my life I have spent time Knitting, Crocheting, Jewelry Making, Needle Point, embroidery, Lace Net Darning, and many more types of needle crafts. Going to Guild helps me to keep Quilting in my life even if it is just marginally. I take two vacations a year, one to Road to California and one to our retreat in Temecula.

I wanted to share some shows I found on PBS - CreateTV

I found this by accident one day and am enjoying the sewing shows. They are on at odd times so I set my DVR and watch them when I can. There are also other arts and crafts, travel, cooking, home improvement and gardening shows. I have watched some of the cooking shows as well. Below is the list of shows that I have watched.

Cox Comm South County Ch 816 Spectrum - Ch 1275

Fons and Porter's Love of Quilting - This is sponsored by the same people that bring us the magazine. It has a lot of information that I find interesting. It is not hosted by Marianne Fons or Liz Porter as they have both retired. The do sometime join as guest. It follows pretty much the same format as when they were hosting it. This is one of my favorite programs that I watch. Best of Sewing with Nancy - this has all types of sewing project. There is quite a bit of quilting. The shows are done with 3-5 episodes on a subject with a book for sell with all the patterns. It's Sew Easy - this is geared to the home sewer. More about clothes, costumes, home decor and accessories. The web site mentions that it featuring apparel, quilting but I haven't seen any quilting as of yet. I enjoy this program. The web site is https://www.itsseweasytv.com/

Fit to Stich - creating a garment that fits perfectly — from pants and sleeves to tank tops and wrap dresses. Fit 2 Stitch concentrates on 3 elements: design, fit, and stitching. Learn the rules of pattern-making and how they apply to making a garment ready for successful stitching

It has programs on how to fit and update a pattern. Unless you want to do the above it is not for quilters. I do watch this but don't save them to watch a 2nd time. The host also has shows on YouTube. The web site is http://www.fit2stitch.com/
