Member of the Month Highlight—Julie Dale

We were a poor family, my father died when I was four and my maternal grandparents died shortly after. Raised by my mother who did not work outside the home. I started making my own clothes, I would go to the stores, observe the styles then go to home and duplicate the style. My mother taught me to sew. I also knit, crochet, tat, embroider.

I began playing as a little girl with my father's suitcase of material scraps, as he was a salesman for material at a department store. I loved it. I made doll clothes, for Barbie, Betsy Wetsy, Tiny Tears, and Betsy McCall. I got interested in my mother's UFO. She gave me a couple of blocks of my grandmother's fan quilt. She sorta told me what to do, but not really, hence my first quilt at 11 years old was a fan quilt.

I left home at 16, went to junior college, then U of M; got married to my wonderful Dick Dale, who had three children. We have a beautiful girl together, (pst. I was told I couldn't have children, yea right).

In Michigan I taught Microwave classes and Introduction to Quilting in my mid-twenties.

We moved to San Diego in 1984. When I moved, I left with my grandmother, great grand-

mother, and mother's quilts. I discovered Alex Anderson's Simply Quilts Show. I have lots of video tapes. I then started going crazy making quilts. I love material, it gives me peace.



ZOOMing By Christy Sprecco

october block of the month

You will need two round 12-cup coffee filters. Press one flat. It should measure 8 1/2" diameter. Cut the circle shape from the bottom of the 2nd coffee filter. It should measure 3 1/4" diameter.

Cut one 10 3/4" solid black square and one 5 3/4" square from the same fabric. The winner of the blocks will square them up to 10 1/2" for the large and 5 1/2" for the small.

Gather strips of autumn color print fabrics 1 1/2" to 2 1/2" for the large circle. Use strips 3/4" to 1 1/2" for the smaller circle.

Use the stitch & flip technique and a scant 1/4" to cover entire paper circles. Trim to the circle.

Press. Use a small zig-zag stitch, with black thread and attach the large circle to the center of the large black square. Do the same with the small circle to the small square. Press both. YOU ARE DONE!

I hope you enjoyed making this very simple block. If you have questions, please don't hesitate to call me. I will share the example at our Zoom meeting.

Quilt Storage

- Store quilts in a pillowcase or wrapped in a sheet
- · Keep in a dark, dry place. Avoid attics or garages. Keep out of direct sunlight
- Quilts should be re-folded 3-4 times a year or place crumpled acid free tissue paper or pantyhose stuffed with batting along folds to help prevent permanent creasing.
- Never store quilts in plastic containers or bags. They must be able to breathe.
- Never store quilts in cardboard or newspaper.
- A wooden box sealed with a clear varnish and lined with muslin or acid free paper works great.

2020-2021 Challenge: UFO (Unfinished Fabric Object) Incentive

Do you have any unfinished projects piled up or hidden somewhere? It's time to confess because

THIS IS IT - an opportunity to get them out and select seven that you'd like to finally finish. It can be any fabric object and there's even an incentive to get them done!

List seven projects on the attached form that you want to finish this year, mail the form to Sandi Delman (address in directory.) At each Zoom meeting beginning in October a number will be drawn to indicate which project is to be finished before the November meeting. Details on how sharing will be done and prizes drawn will be explained at the September meeting. We haven't yet decided to share on Zoom, or all at once when we meet at Renette Center, but prizes will be the same as last year: \$10 cash prize for each month and accumulated names will be in the final \$50 drawing in June. Unfinished projects will have the same \$1. penalty.

Details:

Fill out the attached form with information about the 7 unfinished projects you'd like to complete this year. Explain what needs to be done to finish each project and give a little information about the project such as the pattern name or dominate color etc, so it can be identified when you show it. There are two forms, they need to be identical. One copy is for you and the other is to be mailed to Sandi Delman.

A member must be in the challenge from the beginning – no jumping in after it has started for any reason.

All projects must be <u>totally</u> finished by the assigned month including a label, if it's a quilt.

However, due to difficulty in getting large quilts quilted in a timely manner, it will be allowed to show an unquilted top **over 45x45** for your name to go in that month's drawing. However the quilt will need to be completed, including a label, for your name to be included in the final June drawing. Technicalities will be decided by the challenge coordinator.

Should you NOT have that month's project done, or have a blank space you'll be "fined" \$1.

***THESE last rules will be discussed at September's meeting and may be changed somewhat:

If you're unable to attend a meeting then give your project to someone to show for you. Your name goes into the monthly drawing only if you show the particular project you were to complete that month. If you complete all 7 projects your name will be in the final drawing 7 times.

Hopefully this will leave us with fewer UFO's and some wonderful finished projects.




