January Block of the Month

Scrappy Heart (9" finished)

You need:

26 assorted red squares, cut 2" (1 1/2" fin.) 4 red/background half sq triangles cut 2"

1 - 6" background square, cut once diagonally

Stitch squares together, following diagram:

Lastly, stitch the large background triangles to the bottom corners.

I drew a sewing line on the back across the corners of each square.

(Or, you could line up your ruler, leaving 1/4" seam allowance beyond sewing line. Trim. Line up cut edge with triangle and sew.)


Press and trim to 9 ½" square.



Member Highlight of the Month-Karen Collin

Don't laugh too hard. When I was asked to share a little bit about me, I googled biography ideas and all kinds of links to dating websites popped up. Yeah, no!

So, I'll start at the beginning. Like many of you I suspect, I learned to sew as a child, taught by my mother, making simple clothes for me and my dolls. Through junior high and high school I made most of my clothes because I was given a clothing allowance and it would go so much further than ready made.

During my third year of college, one of my roommates made a quilt.so I gave it a try too. The year was 1977 and our template was an index card, we cut the fabrics out with scissors and the layout looked like staggered bricks. Oh yeah, and the fabrics were browns, rusts and orange "calico" florals. The back was a sheet, batting a polyester high loft and I tied it, not nearly close enough. After one washing, it ended up pretty lumpy in places. I guess it's kind of amazing I made another quilt.

When I married my husband, I was reintroduced to quilting through my mother-in-law, Margaret Collin. Margaret was a long time member of Sunshine so I started tagging along to meetings as a guest. And the rest is history.

Over time, my quilting interests have evolved, from the matchy-matchy, very few fabric quilts to the scrappier the better, and now to controlled scrappy. Discovering Bonnie Hunter and her scrap-saver system was a game changer. And so was her Leader and Enders... I have made so many extra quilts with that simple idea.

I love taking quilting classes because I always, always learn something even if the technique is not one I will continue with. One of my current passions is hand piecing, which finally "clicked" when I watched a video from Mickey Depre and additional tips from a class taught by Jen Kingwell.

In addition to quilting, I love to collect and putz with old sewing machines. I got my first one, a 1940 Singer Featherweight from Patti Williams. Such a sweet machine. And that lead to many, many more. My current everyday piecer is a Singer 301. The Italian Necchi machines are amazing and a couple years ago I picked up an early 60's Pfaff model 139. That was the machine I learned to sew on, all those many years ago and when I sat in front of it, it was like seeing an old friend. Last but not least is Wanda, my Gammill Optimum. She's turning 18 this year. I love the days I get to "dance" with her but I think the decision I made not to make long arming a full time business was a good one. The balance of time between my own and customer projects has helped keep the passion alive for me.

I consider myself an introvert, but I have to say, I've missed the meetings, retreats, shows, classes, the connection to other fiber artists that inspire me so. Thank goodness for social media and apps like Zoom that help keep us connected, if even just a little.

I'll end with a photo of a quilt that is my heart quilt for 2020. It has oodles of recycled men's shirts and some lovely African fabrics I've been collecting for a while. No pattern, just an adaptation of a quilt I saw online. I'm calling it Positively Better Together.
