Member Highlight of the Month-Sandi Delman



I was born in Washington, D.C., the first of four children to my U.S. Air Force father and part-time Kinney Shoe Store accountant mom. I was raised in Maryland with a few years living in Hawaii then back to Maryland, Virginia, and then back to Maryland until moving west to San Diego in 1985. My start in sewing came in Home Economics classes. My maternal grandmother was a quilter, she did all of her quilts by hand; both applique and cross stitch. Twice a month grandma would meet with her church quilting bee. The entire group would sit around a frame, or even two, hand quilting each other's projects. I remember as a child being present during one of these occasions. My mom didn't get the quilt making urge, but instead made clothes for me and my siblings and dolls. Grandma always kept the beds warm and mom always kept our bodies warm.

From aprons, elastic waist shorts, and draw string tops I eventually got into cross stitch squares that would many years later be quilted in one of my grandmother's church quilting bee. Curtains and pillows came next and a try at quilt as you go squares. Made like pillows that would eventually be sewn together...not! Then I began a phase of making outfits for dancers and more tailored clothing for both genders. I even made clothing for a Miss Teen Pageant.

In 1999 my love of quilting was born out of a desire to have decoration on my home's empty walls. I have always loved working with scraps, but it took a very long time to have a stash like I have today to pull from. I love both traditional and paper pieced techniques. I do fumble through applique projects and frankly starting to feel much more confident in taking a new design on. I feel comfortable with any cotton cloth and always on the hunt for a good challenge. I'm right now slowly heading down the road of creating miniatures. Wool on the other hand still has me a bit intimidated, but slowly and surely I'll build up confidence with this medium too. There was a time I could say that I have no UFOs...alas that time is gone! I prefer working on just one project at a time although this isn't always the way it ends up. I was a Project Linus chairperson with Canyon Quilt Guild for a bunch of years. I've been published several times in Quiltmaker and once in Australian Homespun. I have also participated in the Road to California Quilt Show and host for Quiltmaker's First Online Mystery Project at Quilters Club of America.

I have taught at Memory Lane, Quilters Paradise, and Paradise Sewing along with trunk shows twice at Sunshine Quilt Guild. I mentored a Girl Scout in achieving the prestigious Gold Award. I have made fundraising quilts for Make-a-Wish Foundation, American Cancer Society, San Diego Humane Society, Tracy's Paws, American Legion Auxiliary, Alzheimer Association, Operation Homefront, and America Supports You. I coordinated the making of several quilt guild opportunity quilts and a few quilt guild challenges. Been on KUSI and written about the quilting craft in news articles. I've also donated quilts to the Veterans Administration, National Children's Home in the United Kingdom, Quilts 4 Cancer, YWCA, and of course more than I can count to Project Linus.

So many of you might know me as kwiltnkats and wondered how this and my "K" naming of quilts came about. My sister unbeknownst to her probably started all of it. When my mom was to have her fourth and last child, having two brothers already, I wanted so bad to have a sister. That wish came true nine years and two days after my birth. Karen is her name and since then I've surrounded myself with "Ks". For years there have been friends and coworkers, pets, email addresses, blog and website names, and hundreds of quilts with the start of their names a "K". I'm nearly always soliciting on my blog help in naming my quilts. I find a word that either starts with a "K" or when converted for a "C" or "Q" can be pronounced as a "K". This can be quite the challenge that "www" helps me out with many a time! Oh by the way my dad came up with kwiltnkats inspired by my love of both.

I have been working to inspire my niece to sew; perhaps not necessarily quilting, but use a sewing machine to craft projects. I purchased a sewing machine for her a few years ago and she has made progress... there is hope that I have passed along my passion to another in our family.

Now let me make sure it is okay with Kosmo and Katastrophy that I sew a little while before turning out the lights.

Announcements:

- Send pictures (jpeg files) of the quilts/projects you would like to share at the Zoom meeting to Christy Sprecco and she will compile a slide show for the meeting. - Kathy states she talked to Renette Center and there was no information on reopening. The Center does not offer Wi-Fi in the room we meet in. We had hoped to be able to use Zoom for speakers even

once we go back to the room.

Floret Flower Block



Pattern "Floret Table Topper" from "Cluck Cluck Sew" by Allison Harris 2016.

Size: ONE block. 10 and ½ inches. (Finished = 10 inches)

Material Requirements: Provided in your kit!

4 squares, 5½ by 5½ inches Flower Petals

White

8 squares, 2 ½ x 2 ½ inches Background Fabric, Light Blue

4 squares, 2 ½ x 2 ½ Flower Centers


All seam allowances are ¼ inch, "right-sides-together" abbreviated RST

- 1. Diagonal Lines: On the WRONG side of each Flower Center (4) & each Light Blue background (8) draw a diagonal line in pencil from corner to corner.
- 2. Make the Petals: On a $5 \% \times 5 \%$ Petal, place 2 background squares and 1 center square on the corners "as shown" with the pencil line facing up. RST
- 3. Sew along the pencil lines, trim the corners leaving ¼ inch, and press the corners out. Repeat until you have 4 Petals.
- 4. Next, sew the 4 Petals together, RST, as shown. The block should measure 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches.
