Reports:

Cuddle Quilts: Tanya presented a new design – Oh My Stars, a free quilt pattern from Pat Sloan. Kits and the pattern were available at the meeting along with all the other items to make cuddle quilts.

Programs: Beth Van Gelder shared the program line up for this year. October will be the only Zoom meeting so we can host Lisa Walton from Australia. (Check out lisawaltonartist.com for beautiful examples of her work.) Workshops are planned for November 13, January 15, February 9, March 9, and April 12. Signups are available. October 11 Lisa Walton "Leap and the Net Will Appear"

In this one hour Zoom presentation, Lisa will take us on her creative journey and you will see how her work has developed over the years and the milestones and 'leaps' she has taken.

November 9 Sandy Corbin "Making Scrappy Quilts Fresh"

"I have always loved using lots of different fabrics in my quilts. This is what drew me to making scrappy quilts. In this talk I describe the different styles of scrappy quilts and share what makes scrappy quilts fresh."

November 13 Sat Sandy Corbin Workshop

We will learn Sandy's Invisible Machine Applique technique as we construct beautiful butterflies in this 6 hour workshop.

January 11 Sue Bouchard "Modern Quilting"

Sue Bouchard has been quilting since she was 12 and sewing since she was 4. She began quilting before rotary cutters and self healing mats! Sue spent over 25 years

working and teaching at Quilt in a Day. She loves making and designing modern quilts.

Her passion is teaching and inspiring others on their creative journey!

January 15 Sue Bouchard "All About Binding"

The goal of this technique-oriented hands-on class is to learn six different methods of binding. They include Straight, French, Accent. Back to Front, Infinity and techniques on how to change the color of the binding to enhance the design of the front of your quilt. Each one offers a different design option for the perfect finished to your design.

February 8 Kim Brownell "Wacky Fusion"

The "Wackydoodle Quilter" is coming from the Sacramento area. Her Wacky Fusion lecture is a combination trunk show and "Challenges, What To Do?" She calls herself the "Wackydoodle Quilter" describing her easygoing, whimsical style and tendancy to ignore the "quilt Police". Kim will spark imagination and inspiration through her passion for quilt challenges.

February 9 Kim Brownell Workshop-Quilted Workshop Jigsaw Puzzle- Sunrise/Sunset

Kim will teach us her quilted jigsaw puzzle technique using raw-edge fusible appliqué. It leaves a negative space between each piece. If a black background fabric is used, your piece will have a wonderful and stunning stained glass look.

March 8 Scarlett Rose "A Look at Modern Celtic Quilts"

Coming to us from Anderson Ca, Scarlet will discuss what's been happening with bias applique. See some amazing bias tape quilt designs made by modern quilters, art quilters and Celtic quilters.

March 9 Scarlett Rose Workshop "Crystalized Celtic Workshop" 6 hours

This innovative Celtic design, if set on point, makes a 32" medallion block. It can also be set on square for a 22" block. Large loops allow for the use of fussy cut large print fabrics or your own inkjet printed fabric. This workshop can be for either hand or machine applique. This block is from the Crystallized Celtic pattern.

April 12 Sue Nash "My Journey to Collage"

Susy Nash is a Certified Laura Heine Instructor. Coming to us from Redlands California, she will share her quilt journey through her quilts.

April 15 Sue Nash Workshop "Featherweight" 6 hours

We will make our own collage of a Featherweight sewing machine in this 6 hour workshop.

May 10 Trudy Cleveland lecture "Shoot Your Quilt"

Trudy started sewing, like many of us at age 12. She is a long-arm quilter who eased into photography by the need to photograph her customers' quilts. "Shoot Your Quilt", includes tips and techniques on using your smart phone for documenting your quilts. It will include why you should take photographs your quilts, how to take professional looking images, and what to do with your images.

Sunshine Quilters of San Diego 2021-2022 Workshops

Saturday, November 13 – Sandy Corbin, Invisible Machine Applique

In this 6-hour workshop, we will learn Sandy's Invisible Machine Applique technique as we construct beautiful butterflies.



Saturday, January 15 - Sue Bouchard, All About Binding

Sue will be presenting a workshop on six methods of binding a quilt, and will cover: straight binding, French, accent, back to front, infinity and techniques on how to change the color of the binding to enhance the design of the front of your quilt.

Wednesday, February 9 – Kim Brownell, Sunrise/Sunset Jigsaw Puzzle

With this technique, students can combine two hobbies, because it is very much like piecing together a jigsaw puzzle. A raw-edge fusible applique is used leaving a negative space between each piece. The background fabric can be in any color, but if black is used, the piece will have a wonderful stained glass look. The \$20 kit is required, and includes the pattern.



Wednesday, March 9 – Scarlett Rose, Crystallized Celtic

This innovative Celtic design, if set on point, makes a 32" medallion block. It can also be set on square for a 22" block. Large loops allow for the use of fuzzy cut large print fabrics or your own inkjet-printed fabric. This workshop can be for either hand or machine applique.



Saturday, April 16 – Sue Nash, Featherweight

In this workshop, we will make our own collage of a Featherweight sewing machine in this 6-hour workshop. A kit of pre-fusible fabrics will be available from the teacher.




September BOM Deadline

2021-2022 Unofficial Challenge: UFO (Unfinished Fabric Object) Incentive

Do you have any unfinished projects piled up or hidden somewhere? It is time to confess because this is it - an opportunity to get them out, dust them off, and free up one of your project storage containers! Select seven that you would like to finally finish. It can be any fabric object.

List seven projects on the attached form that you want to finish this membership year, mail (email fine) the form to Sandi Delman (address in directory.) At each meeting beginning in October a number will be drawn to indicate which project is to be finished before the next meeting. There will be no prizes associated to this Unofficial Challenge except for bragging rights!

Details:

Fill out the attached form with information about the seven unfinished projects you would like to complete this year. Explain what needs to be done to finish each project and give a little information about the project such as the pattern name or dominate color etc, so it can be identified when you show it. There are two forms, they need to be identical. One copy is for you and the other is to be mailed (email fine) to Sandi Delman (address in directory), hopefully before the October meeting when the first number will be drawn.

A member must be in the challenge from the beginning - no jumping in after it has started for any reason.

All projects must be totally finished by the assigned month including a label, if it is a quilt. However, due to difficulty in getting large quilts quilted in a timely manner, it will be allowed to show an unquilted top **over 45x45** for your name to go in that month's bragging rights drawing. However, the quilt will need to be completed, including a label, for your name to be included in the final June drawing.

Should you NOT have that month's project done you will not be included in the bragging rights drawing for that month (except if you apply to the over 45x45 exception).

If you're unable to attend a meeting then give your project to someone to show for you.

Your name goes into the monthly bragging rights drawing only if you show the particular project you were to complete that month. If you complete all seven projects your name will be in the final bragging rights drawing seven times. If you don't get the 45x45 quilt, that exception mentioned above, your name will be withdrawn from the final bragging rights drawing.

If your project needs to be done and ownership changed before it is called to be worked you can show it at any month. You will be included in that project's monthly bragging rights drawing. There are seven opportunities for you to be the Grand Bragging Rights winner!

Hopefully this will leave us with fewer UFOs and some wonderful finished projects.

October Block of the Month

Punkin' Patch A Bonnie Hunter Pattern

We will be making 1 striped pumpkin block.

Orange scraps

at least 5" long and 3/4" to 2" wide

Black Background, Plain or small print

4 - 1 3/4" squares

2- 2 1/2" x 3" rectangles

1 - 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangle

1 - 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangle


<u>Green</u>

1 - 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangle


Directions

trim strip set to 4 1/2" x 6 1/2". Press seams in one direction.

Using the black 1 3/4" squares add to corners of your pumpkin. Trim corners and Press to black.



Make stem following picture. Using the green piece and the 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" black.



Trim to 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" Press to black. Add the 2 1/2" x 3" black pieces to each side of stem. Press to black.

Sew the 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" black to top ro bottom of pumpkin. Press to black

Pumpkin will measure 6 1/2" wide x 8 1/2" tall.


