

Have a li'l featherweight sewing machine?


Join us in March (date and location to be determined) to learn how to clean, oil, and thread your precious antique.

## Sunshine Quilters – Board Meeting Minutes – July 30, 2022

Items discussed:

Non-profit status – the guild's non-profit status lapsed a few years ago. Lorna and Kathy M looking into what it would take to reinstate. Meanwhile, need to ensure we are not claiming non-profit status on our publications and need to make sure all our drawings are handled properly.\*\*

Budget – Reviewed the year end 2022 financial statement to draft a 2022-2023 budget. Goal is to have a balanced budget which means we need to brainstorm increased membership and fund-raising ideas. A fundraising committee has been organized.

Income Ideas:

Craft Fair – either 2 days or 1 day with a double booth. A double booth would allow us to display quilts for sale (donated by the membership).

- Yard sale Lorna is willing to host a yard sale at her lower garage. She can store items there in advance. Need Christy's Pop up and others if available. Items donated should be clean, usable items. Could also do a bake sale.
- Opportunity Quilt need to increase the sales of this beyond the members \$20 worth of tickets. Discussed traveling to other guilds, need two people. Kathy M to get a meeting list together. Can also list our quilt o the SCCQG website.
- Quilt Auction discussed hosting a quilt auction for the general public, perhaps at a VFW/Elks/ Masonic lodge. Checking with membership to see if anyone has a connection. These would be quilts donated by the membership.

Sept Meeting – ice cream social. Discussed the small ice cream cups and toppings. Members to fix their ice cream as they come in and be seated as we have very special and fun speaker coming to speak at the meeting. Members may bring a guest to attend free (membership drive). There will be no sharing in Sept as we need to introduce new board & committees and have a speaker. Save those great projects for Oct.

Sherri has arranged for 6 workshops this year. Due to increased costs of speakers and workshops, the fee will be increased to \$40 for members and \$50 to non-members. We need to advertise our workshops to other guilds.

Advertising – Karen Collins will not be advertising any longer as she no longer will be taking quilts to long arm. Would really love a new Advertising Chair to step up so Christy can turn over files to focus on secretary work.

One or two speakers did not submit the W-9 tax form. Christy mailing some blanks to Sherri. Speakers must submit forms.

# Attention Sunshine Quilters of San Diego!

Last year guest speaker, Scarlet Rose, mentioned a Paint Chip Challenge that she'd used and we're going to borrow from her brilliant idea! She said "Her local guild has done this Challenge as a special exhibit for several of their quilt shows. The chair picks a color, then choses a paint chip with 3 or more shades of that color on it. Everyone has to use those shades in their quilts and they're allowed to pick one other color to go with it."

I chose this teal colored paint chip from Home Depot's Glidden display. We're going to loosen the rules a bit and have some fun!

## **OUR CHALLENGE RULES ARE:**

- You must use three or more colors from my chosen paint chip – example on the right. I'll bring a real-life paint chip or two to the September 13, 2022 meeting.
- You may choose to use ONE other color ONLY. But this extra color is not required
- We do not consider black, grey or white a color, so you may use any number of black to white hues in your quilt. However, they must be pure – no hint of a color in your grays – even of the one extra color you may use.

Your quilt must be 18" square or larger.

Your quilt must be finished and ready for judging at the May 9, 2023 guild meeting.

Ok, ladies – YOU'VE BEEN CHALLENGED! Have fun and let the creative juices start churning!!

Sunshine Quilters' Retreat Vina de Lestonnac, Temecula CA May 11-14, 2023




It's time to start making plans for our next retreat. I would like

to thank everyone who attended last year for providing feedback. You had some great ideas!! Things staying the same: Our contract is for 20 attendees and we will cap at 22. Everyone was in agreement that it was nice to have a work table to themselves. Vaccine requirements and a signed liability waiver as per Vina.

Activities - the quantity and type seemed to be to everyone's liking last year so we will do something very similar. A theme - will be announced no later that the November meeting. Things changing: In the interest of making the event totally self supporting and not reliant on additional funding from the guild, the cost will be going up a little. 4 days/ 3 nights will be \$450, 3 days and 2 nights will be \$335. That amount is all inclusive.... There will not be other \$\$ requested including \$ for a staff tip etc. (exception - an optional massage) Non members will pay the same fee as members. **Tuesday, September 13, 2022** - This is our traditional Ice Cream Social, but we will also have a Swinging, Singing Surprise Guest Speaker this month. Please come and enjoy the start of a new exciting start to our year of guest speakers and workshops. There will be no project sharing this month so please save your completed projects for the October meeting.

**Tuesday, October 11, 2022** – Lecture by member Tanya Althof on "Artistic Hand Work". She will share samples and discuss embellishments on art quilts. **Saturday, October 15, 2022** – Workshop by Tanya Althof. We will work on a beautiful Welcome sign wall hanging. She has many creative ideas for this lovely project.

**Tuesday, November 8, 2022** – Lecture and Trunk Show by Emily Bailey on her Crumb Quilts. **Wednesday, November 9, 2022** – Workshop by Emily Bailey on Crumb Quilting Basics. Crumb quilting is the ultimate way to zero waste patchwork using tiny scraps or 'crumbs' of fabric that are so small that most people would throw them away. This collection includes instructions and techniques for how to turn your stash of crumbs into beautiful quilts and quilted projects.

**Tuesday**, **December 13**, **2022** – This is our traditional Holiday Pot Luck Dinner. But we will also have an Ugly, Funny Christmas Garb contest. Come dressed to impress and enjoy!

**Tuesday, January 10, 2023** – Lecture by Cindy Myers on "Coloring My Quilt Work". She will share with us how she picks colors and fabrics for her quilts through a showing of some of her Judy Niemeyer quilts.

**Saturday, January 14, 2023** – Workshop by Cindy Myers on Broken Daisy Placemats which is a paper piecing project. Make a set of these great placemats and learn basic paper piecing techniques and a new curved piecing technique.







**Tuesday, February 14, 2023** – Lecture by Dawn Heese, who is an author, pattern and fabric designer who will share vintage inspired designs for today's quilters as shown in her Linen Closet Designs book.

**Monday, February 13, 2023** – Workshop by Dawn Heese. The exact pattern is to be determined from her new book.

**Tuesday, March 14, 2023** – We will have an in-house roundabout where members will share specific techniques to the guild in small numbers as you rotate through the room. **Friday, March 17, 2023** – This will be a fun Guild Sew-In day where we will work as a group on our own PIGS (projects in grocery sacks). **Secret Pal:** Janet Harris will have sign-up sheets and info. Please see Janet at this meeting for all your information.


