


Sunshine Quilters of San Diego meets the second Tuesday of each month (Sept-June) at Renette Park at 935 South Emerald Ave., El Cajon



Minutes— January 10, 2023

The meeting opened with a discussion on the 2023 Summers Past craft fair. After discussion options, members agreed to participate in the November 4-5 craft fair this year instead of December. Members agreed we could have a greater variety of holiday items, including fall/Thanksgiving themed. We will still have the tree for ornaments too.

The guild needs a 2 nd VP of Programs to begin working on our programs for 2023-2024 year. The SCCQG meets April 8 (via Zoom) for a "Meet the Speakers" and we would like to have someone in place to virtually attend this meeting.

Retreat – Karen Collins – Vina de Lestonnac contacted Karen to advise us of a rate increase of \$4/meal per person. We all know how costs have risen and Vina cannot cover the cost without an increase. We have 8 meals to cover. There was much discussion on eliminating a meal in favor of going out or a pot luck. In the end, the membership voted to just increase the cost per person to cover the meals. 2024 prices will be higher and we may need to seek a new venue for retreats. We will need to seek out door prizes for retreat. Karen will send out packets soon. Theme for the retreat: Birds of a Feather. Karen has great patterns for birds for the block challenge.

Sherri displayed the wheel of strips and Fat Quarter stack. Participating members will have to guess the final weight of the wheel of strips and the final height of the Fat Quarter stack.

Cuddle quilts were distributed in December to the El Cajon Women's Club for their women's shelter program, an orphanage in Tijuana and to Rady's/Ronald MacDonald house. Rady's said the 40 they received would last them about 2 weeks and they are very happy to receive more.

Row Sampler <u>4-Patch Row</u> Light Green - 2 - 1 1/2" strips Dark Green - 2 - 1 1/2" strips <u>9-Patch Row</u> Light - 3 - 1 1/2" strips Dark - 3 - 1 1/2" strips <u>Bear Paw Row</u> Background 1/4 yard Cut - 8 - 2 1/2" squares Cut - 16 - 3" squares Bear Paws (8 different 5" x 12" rectangles) From each of your browns cut: 2 - 3" squares 1 - 4 1/2" square



Attention Sunshine Quilters of San Diego!

Last year guest speaker, Scarlet Rose, mentioned a Paint Chip Challenge that she'd used and we're going to borrow from her brilliant idea! She said "Her local guild has done this Challenge as a special exhibit for several of their quilt shows. The chair picks a color, then choses a paint chip with 3 or more shades of that color on it. Everyone has to use those shades in their quilts and they're allowed to pick one other color to go with it."

I chose this teal colored paint chip from Home Depot's Glidden display. We're going to loosen the rules a bit and have some fun!

OUR CHALLENGE RULES ARE:

- You must use three or more colors from my chosen paint chip example on the right.
- You may choose to use ONE other color ONLY. But this extra color is not required
- We do not consider black, grey or white a color, so you may use any number of black to white hues in your quilt. However, they must be pure – no hint of a color in your grays – even of the one extra color you may use.

Your quilt must be 18" square or larger.

Your quilt must be finished and ready for judging at the May 9, 2023 guild meeting.

Ok, ladies – YOU'VE BEEN CHALLENGED! Have fun and let the creative juices start churning!!




