Now all the kids will have one.) 20 quilts went to the Women's Shelter, and we received this response, "A big THANK YOU to the Sunshine Quilters of San Diego as they donated 20 beautiful quilts. When we dropped off the quilts and stockings, we were told they had prayed for blankets the night before. Truly a blessing to them." We gave 45 quilts to Rady's Children's Hospital Ronald McDonald House with this response, "Good Morning Sunshine Quilters: Thank you so much for these beautiful quilts! Nothing says, 'I care about you,' more than a handmade gift. Your thoughts and commitment to us does not go unnoticed! Please share this email with the rest of the ladies and express our gratitude!"

As you meet new people in the new year, please invite them to attend and then join our Guild. There is no entry requirement for membership, all people at all skill levels are welcome. Let's share the community that we have built.





Row Sampler - Cabin and trees Background 1/4 yard 2 - 1 1/2" strips 2 - 6" x 4" rectangles (small tree) 2 - 2" x 5" rectangles 3 - Template A (large tree) 3 - Template A reversed (large tree) From remaining Fabric cut 25 1 1/2" squares Chimney 2" x 20" strip 10 - 1 1/2" squares Wall 2" x 20" strip 5 - 1 1/2" x 3 1/2" rectangles Roof 8: x 6: rectangle 5 - 1 1/2" x 5 1/2" rectangle Cabin 4 1/2" strip 2 - 1 1/2" strips 5 - 1 1/2" x 5 1/2" rectangles 10 - 1 1/2" squares 5 - 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangle Door 8" x 3" rectangle 5 - 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangle Window 2" x 10" rectangle 5 - 1 1/2" squares Grass 4 1/2" strip 5 - 1 1/2 x 5 1/2" rectangles 4 - 2" x 2 1/2" rectangles (small tree) 6 - 2" x 3" rectangles (large Tree) Small Tree 2 - 5" squares Large Tree 3 - 5 1/2" squares


The trees are Paper Pieced, so just bring your greens and we will go over paper piecing at the class.

Tuesday, **January 10**, **2023** – Lecture by Cindy Myers on "Coloring My Quilt Work". She will share with us how she picks colors and fabrics for her quilts through a showing of some of her Judy Niemeyer quilts.

Saturday, January 14, 2023 – Workshop by Cindy Myers on Broken Daisy Placemats which is a paper piecing project. Make a set of these great placemats and learn basic paper piecing techniques and a new curved piecing technique.



Tuesday, February 14, 2023 – Lecture by Dawn Heese, who is an author, pattern and fabric designer who will share vintage inspired designs for today's quilters as shown in her Linen Closet Designs book.

Monday, February 13, 2023 – Workshop by Dawn Heese. The exact pattern is to be determined from her new book.

Tuesday, March 14, 2023 – We will have an in-house roundabout where members will share specific techniques to the guild in small numbers as you rotate through the room. **Friday, March 17, 2023** – This will be a fun Guild Sew-In day where we will work as a group on

January Program and Workshop January 19 and 21 We are so excited to welcome Peggy Martin, an award- winning quilt teacher, designer, and creator of Quick-Strip Paper Piecing technique. She will be sharing her lecture, Beyond Tradition, which will expand our creativity by using traditional quilts as a springboard for design inspiration. She will show us how one idea leads to another, making one small change at a time to come up with totally new ideas and looks. Traditional quilts and the more contemporary ones that result from going one step beyond will be shown and discussed.

On Saturday, January 21st she will lead us in a workshop titled, New York Beauty. She will lead us through her quick-strip paper piecing technique and machine appliqué instead of curved seams to create a beautiful block. There are only 16 seats available at Rosie's! Member cost for the workshop will be \$40.00 each.

Attention Sunshine Quilters of San Diego!

Last year guest speaker, Scarlet Rose, mentioned a Paint Chip Challenge that she'd used and we're going to borrow from her brilliant idea! She said "Her local guild has done this Challenge as a special exhibit for several of their quilt shows. The chair picks a color, then choses a paint chip with 3 or more shades of that color on it. Everyone has to use those shades in their quilts and they're allowed to pick one other color to go with it."

I chose this teal colored paint chip from Home Depot's Glidden display. We're going to loosen the rules a bit and have some fun!

OUR CHALLENGE RULES ARE:

- You must use three or more colors from my chosen paint chip example on the right.
- You may choose to use ONE other color ONLY. But this extra color is not required
- We do not consider black, grey or white a color, so you may use any number of black to white hues in your quilt. However, they must be pure – no hint of a color in your grays – even of the one extra color you may use.

Your quilt must be 18" square or larger.

Your quilt must be finished and ready for judging at the May 9, 2023 guild meeting.

Ok, ladies – YOU'VE BEEN CHALLENGED! Have fun and let the creative juices start churning!!





