# **Sunshine Quilters UFO Club 2024-25**

Congratulations to the October winner – Oh my gosh!! Janet Harris! You are so lucky!!

Do you have projects that need finishing? It's never too late to join the club. All you need is \$10 to join for the year and some completed and labeled UFOs.

A reminder of how this works...

A UFO can be any sewing, quilting, knitting, crocheting, painting, etc. project that you started and would like to finally finish. We allow finished tops that you plan to pass on to Cuddle Quilts for others to quilt to count as a finished UFO. However, since quilting and binding a quilt often takes so much longer than making a top, 3 unfinished tops will count as one UFO entry. A maximum of 3 entries will be allowed per monthly drawing. Confused??? Here are some examples:

You finish 3 quilts and crocheted a blanket: you are allowed 3 entries into the drawing. You finish 6 Cuddle Quilt tops: you are allowed 2 entries into the drawing.

You finish 3 Cuddle Quilt tops plus 2 quilts: you are allowed 3 entries into the drawing.

Reminder that if you would like to participate in Secret Santa this year, please bring a wrapped gift, handmade or spend no more than \$30.00. We will play a gift exchange game, which should be fun. Contact Pam Davis if you have questions.

**December 10, 2024 Potluck night!** Our advertisers will have displays and there's a possibility of an auction and/or other items for sale.

<u>January 14, 2025 Lecture:</u> Peter Chang, new owner of Cozy Creative Center, will talk about his adventures on becoming a guilt store owner – and possibly bringing a special guest with him.

ALSO January 14th Tommie DQ will be available to sharpen scissors.

Tommie comes highly recommended and has sharpened scissors for the Old Globe Theater costume department and for hair stylists. He has a mobile unit, but would like a count (if possible) of who will be bringing what. Please let me (Kathy Barnes) know if you're thinking of using his service. He charges a maximum of \$24 a pair – including pinking shears. Smaller ones may be less. If there are several he'll bag them, take them home and then deliver all to one person.



#### Road to California Quilters Conference January 22-25, 2025

Call for <u>Entries SCCQG 2025 Special</u> Exhibit "*Tradition with a Twist*" - This exhibit will display how quilters take a "traditional" pattern, give it "a twist," and create an interesting new work. Group and individual made quilts accepted for consideration. Quilts of all styles and techniques are welcome so long as they fit the requirements below.

Entry requirements are as follows (please read carefully):

The quilt must have been finished in 2023/2025 and be in good condition.

Size constraint: perimeter should <u>not be larger than 240" overall</u> and <u>no smaller than 60" overall</u>. Items that don't meet this criteria may be accepted and may be folded for display purposes. 40-48" width is preferred to help with displaying quilts.

Embellishments must not protrude more than 1/2" from the surface of the guilt.

The guilt must be made of fabric and guilted either by hand, or machine, or both.

It must be constructed of three layers and bound or closed around all guilt edges.

Quilt/hanging must have an attached 4" hanging sleeve (basted or safety pins allowed).

Entrant must be a current member of an SCCQG Member Guild or an Affiliate member.

Enter by email. Entries must include a separate digital **jpeg** photo named as follows: entrant's last name\_ (underscore)name of quilt\_(underscore)guild initials.jpeg. For example: "Weber\_chubby\_LBMQG.jpeg" Each entry <u>must have</u> a short paragraph describing how the entry is a twist on a traditional pattern. (The Exhibit curator reserves editing rights.)

#### **Timetable**

#### December 14, 2024 (Saturday) All entry forms and photos due.

Entries need to include a current email address for confirmation of receipt.) See instructions above.

**December 28, 2024** Notification will be e-mailed by this date. Accepted entries will receive instructions for quilt shipment. Entrants will be responsible for all shipping and insurance costs. All entries are required to have a 4" hanging sleeve. Sleeves may be basted or safety pinned in place. Entries must be in a cloth bag or pillowcase with entrant's name and phone number.

**January 15, 2025** Deadline for receipt of exhibit quilts. Accepted quilts must be received by the SCCQG Road2CA Curator (Kate Weber) for exhibition.

**January 22-25, 2025** Quilts will be displayed as part of the SCCQG "Stitching a Community Together" Exhibit at Road to California, Ontario Convention Center, Ontario, California.

**January 25 – February 15, 2025** Quilts will be returned according to prior arrangements. Unclaimed quilts will be donated to a charity.

SCCQG and Road reserve the right to reject quilts not suitable for hanging.

#### March 15<sup>th</sup> Workshop Information

The guild charges \$40 for workshop attendance (same for members and non-members.) March  $15^{\text{th}}$ 's workshop "Moon Dance" by Sue Bouchard has an addition charge of \$60. payable to Sue for a kit. **The kit includes all fabrics, pattern and templates to complete the quilt top including the Binding. 32" x 42"** The total cost to attend the "Moon Dance" workshop is \$40 to the guild and \$60 to Sue Bouchard (\$100 total) Perhaps a bit pricy – but it does include all you need to complete the project top. Tommie comes highly recommended, is very experienced and has sharpened scissors for the Old Globe Theater costume department and for hair stylists. He has a mobile unit, but would like a count (if possible) of who will be bringing what. Please let me know if you're thinking of using his service (Kathy Barnes - # in directory.) Tommie charges a maximum of \$24 a pair - including pinking shears. Smaller ones may be less, he'll let you know. If there are many jobs that night he'll bag the scissors with your name, take them home to sharpen and then deliver all to one person at one time (probable me.) 







