

Sunshine Quilters UFO Club 2024-25

Congratulations to the October winner – Oh my gosh!! Janet Harris! You are so lucky!! Do you have projects that need finishing? It's never too late to join the club. All you need is \$10 to join for the year and some completed and labeled UFOs.

A reminder of how this works...

A UFO can be any sewing, quilting, knitting, crocheting, painting, etc. project that you started and would like to finally finish. We allow finished tops that you plan to pass on to Cuddle Quilts for others to guilt to count as a finished UFO. However, since guilting and binding a guilt often takes so much longer than making a top, 3 unfinished tops will count as one UFO entry. A maximum of 3 entries will be allowed per monthly drawing. Confused??? Here are some examples:

You finish 3 quilts and crocheted a blanket: you are allowed 3 entries into the drawing. You finish 6 Cuddle Quilt tops: you are allowed 2 entries into the drawing. You finish 3 Cuddle Quilt tops plus 2 quilts: you are allowed 3 entries into the drawing.

FAT QUARTER FUN

Guidelines for Fat Quarter Drawing

- Bring a fat quarter that coordinates with that month's theme.
- Turn in your fat quarter at the Fat Quarter Basket at the Welcome table.
- Your name will be entered once in the drawing.
- The drawing will be held during the meeting.
- If your name is drawn you win the fat quarters.

TIP: If you are participating in the Fat Quarter Drawing, and do not like a particular color theme for the month, don't add your name to the basket. We want everyone to be happy with the fat quarters they win.

Combining Triangle in a Square patches with Pieced Triangle Squares gives the illusion of curves without any curved piecing. The Stars are brought together with Quarter Square patches. Your patchwork will dance across the Background! Kits - \$60 includes all fabrics, pattern and templates to complete the quilt top including the Binding. 32" x 42"

Road to California Quilters Conference January 22-25, 2025

Call for Entries SCCQG 2025 Special Exhibit "*Tradition with a Twist"* - This exhibit will display how quilters take a "traditional" pattern, give it "a twist," and create an interesting new work. Group and individual made quilts accepted for consideration. Quilts of all styles and techniques are welcome so long as they fit the requirements below.

Entry requirements are as follows (please read carefully):

The quilt must have been finished in 2023/2025 and be in good condition.

Size constraint: perimeter should <u>not be larger than 240" overall</u> and <u>no smaller than 60" overall</u>. Items that don't meet this criteria may be accepted and may be folded for display purposes. 40-48" width is preferred to help with displaying quilts.

Embellishments must not protrude more than 1/2" from the surface of the guilt.

The quilt must be made of fabric and quilted either by hand, or machine, or both.

It must be constructed of three layers and bound or closed around all quilt edges.

Quilt/hanging must have an attached 4" hanging sleeve (basted or safety pins allowed).

Entrant must be a current member of an SCCQG Member Guild or an Affiliate member.

Enter by email. Entries must include a separate digital **jpeg** photo named as follows: entrant's last name_ (underscore)name of quilt_(underscore)guild initials.jpeg. For example: "Weber_chubby_LBMQG.jpeg" Each entry <u>must have</u> a short paragraph describing how the entry is a twist on a traditional pattern. (The Exhibit curator reserves editing rights.)

Timetable

December 14, 2024 (Saturday) All entry forms and photos due.

Entries need to include a current email address for confirmation of receipt.) See instructions above.

December 28, 2024 Notification will be e-mailed by this date. Accepted entries will receive instructions for quilt shipment. Entrants will be responsible for all shipping and insurance costs. All entries are required to have a 4" hanging sleeve. Sleeves may be basted or safety pinned in place. Entries must be in a cloth bag or pillowcase with entrant's name and phone number.

January 15, 2025 Deadline for receipt of exhibit quilts. Accepted quilts must be received by the SCCQG Road2CA Curator (Kate Weber) for exhibition.

January 22-25, 2025 Quilts will be displayed as part of the SCCQG "Stitching a Community Together" Exhibit at Road to California, Ontario Convention Center, Ontario, California.

January 25 – February 15, 2025 Quilts will be returned according to prior arrangements. Unclaimed quilts will be donated to a charity.




These cat ornaments sell out fast at the craft show. Kits were distributed for members to take home and make and return to the November meeting.


