
Cuddle Quilts

Your Featherweight sewing machine

Machine oil Small lint brush

Small screw driver (small enough to remove your needle plate)

Bring Your Dull Scissors to next Meeting!!

January 14th Tommie DQ will be available to sharpen scissors.

Tommie comes highly recommended, is very experienced and has sharpened scissors for (among a long list of others) The Old Globe Theater costume department and for many hair stylists.

Because of the interest there will probably be too many pair for Tommie to sharpen in one night so the process will be:

- Put your scissors in an envelope (he recommends a free priority USPO envelope which I will have on hand Tuesday night)
- Write your name and phone # on a card (I will have 3x5 cards available also)
- Pay \$24 per pair (or ask if you have a question about yours because it may be less) He takes cash, check or Venmo.
- He'll take them all home to sharpen (having your phone number in case he has a question.)
- After all are sharpened he'll mail them all to me in one box and I'll distribute at the February meeting unless you wish to pick yours up early and arrange to meet me somewhere.

Sunshine Quilters of San Diego Calendar, Speakers and Workshops 2024 - 2025

January 14, 2025 Lecture: Peter Chang, new owner of Cozy Creative Center, will talk about his adventures on becoming a quilt store owner - and possibly bringing a special guest with him.

<u>ALSO January 14th Tommie DQ will be available to sharpen scissors.</u>
Tommie comes highly recommended and has sharpened scissors for the Old Globe Theater costume department and for hair stylists. He has a mobile unit, but would like a count (if possible) of who will be bringing what. Please let me (Kathy Barnes) know if you're thinking of using his service. He charges a maximum of \$24 a pair – including pinking shears. Smaller ones may be less. If there are several he'll bag them, take them home and then deliver all to one person.

January 18, 2025 FEATHERWEIGHT MAINTENANCE Workshop: Tom Griesgraber an expert Featherweight technician will show us how to care for and maintain our individual Featherweight machines. Tom will be available from 10-2 and afterward we can work on our own projects using our newly adjusted machines.

February 11, 2025 Lecture: Pam Davis - our very own Pam Davis will present a trunk show featuring her Kim Diehl quilts and share some inside secrets.

March 11, 2025 Lecture: Sue Bouchard has been sewing since she was four and guilting since she was twelve. She loves to design and make modern quilts which are influenced by traditional designs. Her passion is teaching and inspiring others. Sue has taught at many Quilt Guilds, International Festivals and Craftours throughout the world. She'll share with you her journey and insights discovered by finding solace in her sewing room. Explore ways to combine styles, techniques and colors to create your own one-of-a-kind quilts. Special emphasis is the use of directional fabrics for effective design elements. Over 35 samples will inspire you!

March 15, 2025: Workshop: "Moon Dance" by Sue Bouchard



Combining Triangle in a Square patches with Pieced Triangle Squares gives the illusion of curves without any curved piecing. The Stars are brought together with Quarter Square patches. Your patchwork will dance across the Background! Kits - \$60 includes all fabrics, pattern and templates to complete the quilt top including the Binding. 32" x 42"

April 8, 2025 Lecture: Christy Sprecco - our very own Christy Sprecco will share her quilting journey and show generational guilts along with some of her own.

March 15th "Moon Dance" Workshop Information

The guild charges \$40 for workshop attendance (same for members and non-members.) March 15th 's workshop "Moon Dance" by Sue Bouchard has an addition charge of \$60 which is payable to Sue for a kit. **The kit includes all fabrics, pattern & templates to complete the 32" x 42" quilt top (incl. binding.)** The total cost to attend the "Moon Dance" workshop is \$40 to the guild and \$60 to Sue Bouchard (\$100 total) This may be a bit pricy – but it does include all you need to complete the project top – plus all you need to bring to the workshop is your sewing machine and sewing supplies (including a cutting mat.)
