




Sunshine Quilters of San Diego meets the second Tuesday of each month (Sept-June) at Renette Park at 935 South Emerald Ave., El Cajon

Do you have projects that need finishing? It's never too late to join the club. All you need is \$10 to join for the year and some completed UFOs.

Fundraising

Several of our members have been busy sorting, pricing, and cataloging items for our **Rise and Shine Boutique** scheduled for 26 April. We have 631 items cataloged—\$3,752.60 if we sell it all! That does not include patterns, books, fabric scraps or FGs.

Have you been decluttering your space? We are accepting donations for the sale. We have one more scheduled date to accept donations and price items. That date is 4 February at 9am at my house. If you have a donation and can't make it on the 4th, call me and we'll arrange a time to drop it off.

As we receive more donations, we will schedule more dates as needed. For fabric donations if smaller than a FQ we'll put them in our scrap box. Buyers will be able to sort through scraps and fill a lunch bag for \$5. FQs will be available separately. Larger fabrics we are measuring length, folding it and placing it in a sealable plastic bag. Please make sure these fabrics don't have any cuts out of them. Place a piece of paper in the bag with the length, i.e. 1 ¼ yd. If you have fabrics of the same line, they can be bagged together, in that case you can write, 1 jelly roll and 1 yd fabric, e.g. Then when we receive it, we can log it in. For fabric kits we are measuring the quantity of fabric in the kit and labeling the bag with that. We are pricing fabric at \$3/yard and wool at \$15/yard. For other items we are basically pricing at ~75% off.

We need your help on April 26th. The items will separated by category and need volunteers to organize and man the different tables.

- Fabric and Kits
- Scrap fabric
- Wool and kits
- Notions
- Yarn and kits
- Stitchery and kits
- Patterns/books
- Doll making

Set up will be the evening before and morning of. We will have early opening hours for our guild members to get first opportunity to find the best deals. (Though some of that has already started—bonus for volunteers.) We'll likely slash prices toward the end of the day.

We would still like more items! Have you checked out Karen Brown's Decluttering series? She's on Facebook at Just Get It Done Quilts. Or you can catch her series on You Tube. We will also have a table to sell the remaining items from our December craft sale. If you would like to make items, that would be great! Any quilt donations for a possible auction?

FAT QUARTER FUN


Guidelines for Fat Quarter Drawing

- Bring a fat quarter that coordinates with that month's theme.
- Turn in your fat quarter at the Fat Quarter Basket at the Welcome table.
- Your name will be entered once in the drawing.

- If your name is drawn you win the fat quarters.

TIP: If you are participating in the Fat Quarter Drawing, and do not like a particular color theme for the month, don't add your name to the basket. We want everyone to be happy with the fat quarters they win.

Your patchwork will dance across the Background! Kits - \$60 includes all fabrics, pattern and templates to complete the quilt top including the Binding. 32" x 42"

Two Featherweight Tables for Sale


